Bel Air Dam Emergency Preparedness


The City of Pittsfield and MA
Department of Conservation &
Recreation's Office of Dam Safety are
working to address deficiencies at the
Bel Air Dam, located between Lenox
Ave. and Wahconah St. Removal of the
dam is expected to begin in 2025/2026.

Until the dam is removed, it is important for residents who live and work in the area downstream from the dam to stay informed and know what to do in the event of an emergency.



KNOW YOUR ZONE

The map below shows areas that could be impacted by sudden flooding in the event of a failure at the Bel Air Dam shaded in blue, as well as designated reception centers. Streets that may experience a high velocity of water from the Bel Air Dam include: **Goodwill Industries Rd.**, **Pontoosuc Ave.**, **Wahconah St.**, **Linden St.**, **Columbus Ave.**, and **West St.**





DURING AN EMERGENCY

- People near or along the west branch of the Housatonic River from the Bel Air Dam to West St. should move to HIGHER GROUND immediately.
- **EVACUATE** immediately if told to do so -- sudden flooding could occur within 15 minutes of an emergency at the dam.
- RECEPTION CENTERS (see starred locations on map) will be open to accommodate anyone who has evacuated, including pets.
- **Stay ALERT** to further announcements from public safety officials.
